Dear Sir:

Re your letter of February 6, 1944, am glad to advise you that we can verify about 80% of your reception from K.S.B.C.

Due to the fact that we have thirteen remote control stations throughout the county, that place their calls through this transmitter, your reception was no doubt 100%. We keep no log on calls originating at the remote control stations.

K S B C operates on a frequency of 1714 K. C. with 500 watts output, unattended, vertical 1/4 wave antenna, We maintain 70 cars with two-way equipment, of which twenty-seven are licensed to this station. The rest are licensed to the cities from which they operate. All California Highway Patrol cars in this county are operated by K S B C.

We have two repeaters, one at an elevation of about 1600 feet and one at 6200 feet, both on ultra high frequency (car) We also monitor stations in the adjacent counties and rebroadcast all traffic of an emergency nature.
