Link 199-Ed3 of which there are four and the cars operate on 37,780kc. Also RCA.

All the equipment was installed under the supervision of William O Koontz former operator at **WORK** in York By two local Hams Charles K Waelde **W3HYH** And myself, it is very pleasing to hear from some one that understands the ham lingo .
