This letter will confirm your reception of radio station W S Y V on the dates of April 3, 1944, at 8:44 P.M.; April 4, 1944, at 7:41 P.M., 7:48 P.M., 8:37 P.M., and 8:52 P.M.; and April 6, 1944, at 7:58 P.M., 7:59 P.M., and 8:19 P.M.

W S Y V consists of a 50 watt Harvey-Wells plate modulated, AM transmitter, crystal controlled, using a type 814 tube in the final amplifier stage.

The antenna is a half-wave doublet, center fed with EOL cable, having a mean height of 55 feet and running approximately north and south. Antenna current is 1.5 amperes without modulation.
