Dear Mr. Geary:

We very much appreciate your interesting letter of October 30, 1943, indicating reception of our various Radio Stations Friday night, October 29, 1943.

The report of your reception of our transmissions on this night are entirely correct with respect to Test 299.

We have five (5) Radio Stations, namely;

WSPH - Richmond, Virginia - 1000 Watts WRIG - Culpeper, Virginia - 1000 Watts WRIF - Appomattox, Virginia- 1000 Watts WBXQ - Wytheville, Virginia- 1000 Watts WAEY - Norfolk, Virginia - - 360 Watts.

It might interest you to know that our Mobile units have been picked up in the State of Iowa. At each of our 1000 watt stations we use a coaxial antenna at the top of a 310-foot tower; and also have a Receiver at Norfolk, Virginia, operating from a coaxial antenna approximately 125 feet in the air.
