Dear Mr. Geary:

Your letter of April 26,th, was received this date and appreciate your very nice remarks concerning the overall reception of our police radio station, and by checking our log find them to correspond to the very last detail of the broadcasts of that date.

Our Police station WFPF. is a composite job being just recently revamped from a Collins 40-B, and is operating with an output of 50 watts, the final stage uses 2-type T40's in a push-pull stage, driver stage is a type 807. crystal oscillator is a 6v6. the audio starts with a two stage pre-amp, using a pair of 6-f-6' into a single 2A3 which drives a pair of 2A3's in pushpull. which drives the Class "B", TZ20's as modulators. Antenna at present is a center-fed Hertz made up of two quarter wave units, approximately 50 feet high. our mobile units are operating on 30580 Kc, and they are Motorola 15 watters, they are working very well over a radius of 7 miles.
