
Practically all the information which I am permitted to divulge at the present time, regarding the construction and operation of this station, will be found on page No. 91 of the Twelfth Biennial Report of the West Virginia Department of Public Safety, which is being mailed you under separate cover.

The antenna described on page No. 93 of our report is not being used at the Station's present location. When the antenna is erected, we have no difficulty in contacting our land stations.

It is our intention to install Frequency Modulated equipment in our Emergency Unit at a later date, since many of our police cars are now equipped with FM transmitters and receivers.
