We received your reception report of August 16, 1957 and have checked it against our station Log and report of the

person operating at that time.
Edward Remington was operating the station at the time He is the station Glaciologist (not a liscensed Ham) but thru agreement with UENC-IGY and the Navy non-liscensed people who have been checked out and are familure with the rules may operate.

Your report is correct in all respects, and very complete

many thanks.

The line up here is a 75A-4 recvr, KWS-1 xmtr, however during the winter menths we ran into some trouble with tube sockets in our final, and not having a radio supply close at hand were running a Jerry Rig final. A pair of 4-125A's in parralell being driven by the KWS-1 at reduced power. Cur power input to the 4-125A's was 750 watts.

The antennae is a two curtain rhombic with $3\frac{1}{2}$ wave lengths to the leg (on 20 meters) directed about 85 degrees west. The antennae was designed for about a 5 deg wave angle on $1\frac{1}{2}$ 20 and 20 deg on 15 meters, it's about 6 ft from the snow in most places and held up with bamboo poles.

I'll give no guarantee to the RIG or Antenna except that it usualy works quite well and that we have close to 3,000 hours loged in operation and are now on our 5th log book.
