Dear Sir,

We acknowledge receipt of your reception report dated 5th October 1959, and in reply we would advise you that the station you heard was ZJT94, operating on 19940 Kc/s, and we confirm that at the time quoted in your report, it was calling London on the upper sideband of a single sideband transmission.

The transmitter is a Marconi SWB11E giving a peak power of 6 Kilowatts and the antenna is a 2 wire Rhombic 100 feet high with 6 wave length sides beamed on London.

At the time of your report we were establishing a special circuit to the BBC London to broadcast a programme called "Two Way Family Favourites" for the Armed Forces in Cyprus to their families in the United Kingdom which was broadcast simultaneously on all the BBC Overseas Services and the BBC and Cyprus medium wave services at 1230 GMT on the 4th October 1959.

The lower sideband is carrying two 300 cycle Frequency Shift Tone Channels centred on 1600 cycles and 2600 cycles below the reinserted carrier.
