Dear Mr. Geary:

We thank you very much for your letter concerning Station WSIB. Our "Log" completely confirms your report of reception.

For your information, we operate on an assigned frequency of 2726 k.c. at 1000 watts power. The transmitter is a Western Electric, Type 443-A-1, and is located at Benning, D. C., operated by remote control from the Power Dispatcher's Office, located in our Main Building at 10th and "E" Streets, N. W. Radiation is by means of a vertical half-way antenna.

Station WSIB is licensed as a Special Emergency Station, and zoned by the Potomac Electric Power Company under the direction of the Substation Department. Certain trucks and Supervisor's cars of the Potomac Electric Power Company and the Capital Transit Company are equipped with receivers tuned only to this station. The transmitter is used only in or during emergencies when other means of communication are not immediately available.

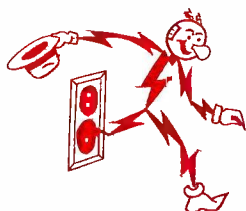
