Dear Sir,

I am very pleased to report reception of KVSL on 11/7/77 on 1450 kHz from 12:35a- 12:44a MST. I should say VERY PLEASED because KVSL is the first 1450 kHz station to push through the sleep of local KYSN which is all-night 7days. Since I started DX'ing from Colorado Springs in 1975, KVSL is the 1st. The following are details of my reception:

- 12:35a Tone ending and KVSL Show Low Az conducting Erequency test and more tone
- 12:39a Tone of ID similar to above & time check " 21 till lam" given by announcer.& more tone
- 12:42a Same ID as before & more tone
- 12:44a Same as at 12:42 and either went off or were covered by KYSN-1460 sleep.

Other complications this morning were severe local thundershowers and high winds causing static at a very high level. My equipment consists of a RBB-4 WWII surplus receiver with a 4' loop antenna run through a transistor pre-amp.

I've been DX'ing for 13 years and have some 620+ verifications from 49 sates and 25 foreign countries. I am enclosing return postage and I's appreciate a verification from KVSL to add to my collection if my report is found correct. Thank you in advance for your time and consideration in anwsering this report.
