Dear Wayne:

Thank you for your report of reception of KMVP Radio, dated July 10, 1987. From the information you provided, we were able to verify your report as being true and accurate.

Please accept this letter as your confirmation of reception of KMVP radio on April 20, 1987, between 7:51 and 8:00 PM MDT from your listening location of Aurora, Colorado.

KMVP operates on 1600 KHz with 5,000 watts for both day and night operation. During daylight hours, KMVP uses a non-directional antenna system consisting of a single 5/8 wave vertical radiator. During night hours, KMVP uses a four-tower directional antenna system which beams our signal to the north from the Lakewood, Colorado area. Your reception of the station was during our directional operation.

You mentioned interference from KCRG in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. During night hours, we protect Cedar Rapids by providing a deep null in their direction. As a result, we have very little signal extending towards Aurora. We think it's funny that we are heard better in Finland at night than we are in parts of Aurora!

Again, thank you for taking the time to write with your report. I always enjoy receiving reception reports from around the world.
