Dear *Wayne,*

We are pleased here at KRYT that you were able to pick up our signal early Monday morning. I must say that I have been surprised at some of the letters I've received from all across the United States.

As this is a general letter, I'll give everyone the basics on our operation here in Colorado Springs. Our transmitter is a Western Electric thousand watter, model 443-A-1. We run the signal through a Dorrough Discriminate Audio Processor model 310. Our antenna is 318' high, however it is -318' to the average terrain.

The programming you heard was our normal simulcast during the daytime hours. We run the "bright-Lively" MOR format from the Drake-Chenault Company from Los Angeles. Our music is designed to entertain the 18-49 demographic audience.

Again, thanks for listening and taking the time to write me concerning the broadcast. Maybe we can do this again on a Monday morning, perhaps an hour later as many of you were not able to pick KRYT up during the first hours of broadcast.
