Dear Wayne;

I am pleased to confirm your reception of KWMX on September 5, 1994 between 12:12pm and 12:24pm MDT on a frequency of 1600 kHz. Power output at the time of your report was 3,800 watts in the non directional mode. KWMX began operating at its licensed daytime power output of 5,000 watts on September 6, 1994. The low output power was caused by an erroneous base impedance measurement some ten years ago. I'm sure the 1.1db power increase made a significant difference at your location!


It is great hearing from you again. I very much remember the tour I gave your group 10 years ago. My KIMN poster, like yours, is framed and hangs in my living room where it also draws many comments from guests.

As you can imagine, the facility has changed a great deal since your visit. Additional studios were added to accommodate KWMX. Along with a few more offices. Technically speaking, our biggest change is making the transition to digital. We are now using digital multitrack editors, in real time, with no more tape editing! The studio transmitter links on both FM's have been converted to digital along with all audio processing. By 1996 we hope to have all the music and spots for all our stations on hard drive systems.

The 950kHz frequency will become all sports in the near future, with new call letters. Classic Country will move to 1600kHz at that time, probably with the same call. Major renovations will be under way soon to accommodate the sports/talk studio.
