Dear Sir,

I am very pleased to report WBAW on their test of January 8, 1968 which I heard from 2:45am-2:50am EST on your assigned frequency of 1330 kHz. The following were the notes I managed to take during that 5 minute period:

- 2:45am Unknown Good music song (sounded like Andy William)
- 2:47am I'll Never Love Again-same artist (engineer dropped needle in middle of the record)
- 2:50am end of song-man spoke "This is WBAW, Evanston Ill. a service to metropolitan Chicago" and then you went off...it is possible you came back on with open carrier in a few minutes, but I'm not sure...

Your signal was very good with only a small amount of QRM from WHOT radio in Youngstown Ohio...1000 w. Dir. There was no fading or atmospheric interference at all. This was probably due to the very low temperature (0°-F), and the lack of clouds or winds in the Buffalo area.

I was using a RBB-4 US Navy surplus receiver with a 36" spiral loop which is directional. I'm located about 10 miles south of Buffalo N.Y. I would appreciate any station publications such as record surveys, coverage maps, stickers, etc.

I am enclosing some information on the ARCC and DX'ing in general and one 6¢ stamp to cover the cost of return postage and I would appreciate a letter of verification on your station letterhead if this report is found correct.
