The leaflet on the early days of radio was very interesting. I plan to use it as a bookmark. The National Radio Club sounds like an interesting organization. Perhaps in exchange for this verification, I might receive a 10-year subscription of something.

I thought perhaps you might like to see our day coverage map and our night contours. Patti's contours you'll have to find out for yourself, if other members of the family allow.

So far, the new night operation has netted reports from North Carolina, Virginia, Kentucky, Pennsylvania, and Nebraska, in addition to yours ... but none yet from Buffalo, nor from Orchard Park.

We are on 24 hours a day, seven days a week, with separate programming on FM. When Patti is off, her place is taken by Dianne Cooksey, so our equal opportunity for female performers looks reasonably good.
