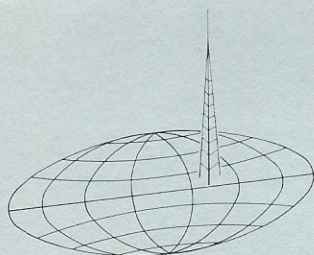


Citadelle . . .

King Henry Christophe is credited for building this 8th wonder of the world, a mountain fortress in northern Haiti. Known as the Citadelle this giant structure was built not only for defense but partly to make his condemned negro people feel that they could achieve one of the architectural and engineering marvels of the age.

The Citadelle was built without cement which is an amazing art in itself. The Citadelle was built in 1811, 2800 feet above sea level, 35 miles south of Cap Haitien.

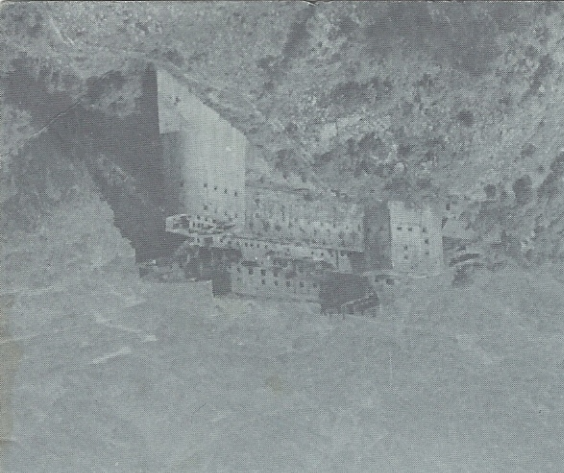

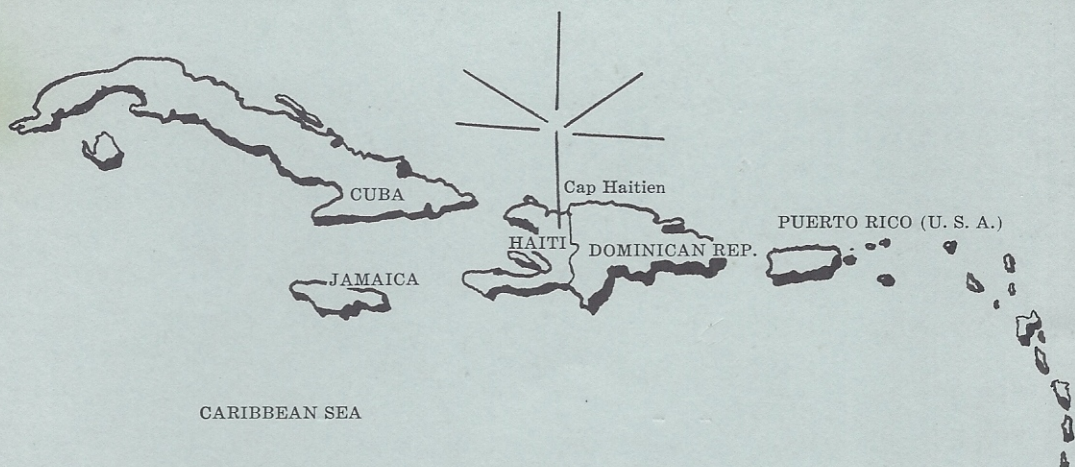
