
This will confirm your correct reception report of January 8, 1968. Please excuse the long delay in answering your report, but we had ordered special QSL cards for this test, and as of the date of this letter they still had not arrived, and we felt we could not delay answering any longer.

WGOH is located in Grayson, Ky., a small town of about 1600 population, and the county seat (Carter), and serves all of north-eastern Kentucky, western West Virginia, and south-eastern Ohio, and operates daytime only, with a power of 5Kw. Transmitters and studios are located atop Signal Hill, about one mile west of Grayson, the highest point in north-eastern Kentucky.

The program format is primarily Country and western, with the late afternoon hours devoted to Pop music. Programing continues on WGOH-FM after AM sign-off, (102.3 MHz, 1450 watts ERP), until 8PM, when the format returns to C&W, until midnight sign-off.

Several requests have been recieved for our coverage map, but our supply has been exhausted.
