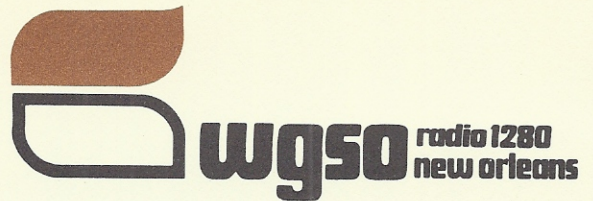

Thanks for your letter recently in which you report reception of WGSO. I am pleased to confirm your report and am enclosing a QSL card.

I have received many reports recently from members of the National Radio Club. I find them useful in measuring propagation from the south toward northern areas, particularly as winter approaches. I do a lot of monitoring in the broadcast band myself but find that along the Gulf coast many U. S. stations receive interference from Caribbean stations, especially Cuban and Mexican stations.

I also apologize for my predecessor regarding your difficulty in obtaining verification earlier. I understand that previous engineers here never regarded any reception reports, whereas I have always QSLed 100 percent.

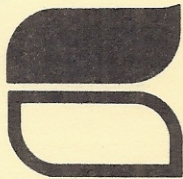
Thanks again for your report.
