Dear Wayne:

What a surprise to receive your report and learn you are hearing KFEZ as far away as Aurora, Colorado. KFEZ is 5,000 watts non-directional in the daytime, 1,000 watts critical time (two hours after sunrise and two hours before sunset) and 250 watts directional at night towards the west. For you to hear a 250 watt station at night with directional antenna is incredible.

We use six antenna at night, which are located east of Downtown Kansas City. We only cover only the urban part of the city at night.

KFEZ was formerly KJLA (call letters were changed October 15, 1992), and went dark in June of 1990. I bought the station after it had been off the air 15 months, and returned it to the air August 28, 1991.


The station KRDS in Tolleson, Arizona is 5 KW-D, 250 W at N, DA-2. The station on 1190 in Dallas is 50 KW-D 5 KW Night, DA-2. I think DA-2 means directional antenna both day and night.

You are correct in program details. We are an "Easy Listening" music station, 24 hours, and our handle is "1190 Easy". You are also correct that our weather is at the bottom of the hour, and we resume our "Easy Music" after the weather. Enclosed is a brochure about KFEZ.

I regret your earlier report did not get answered. It is not like our staff to be remiss in answering correspondence.

Please tune us in again and let me know how we are doing.
