Dear Mr. Heinen,

This letter is to confirm your reception of KQFN, 1550 kHz on February 19th, 1995. Your listing of programming could only have been from our station.

Our company took over operation of KQFN in March of this year. On September 1st, 1996 the call letters were changed back to the original KQWB to match it's sister station KQWB-FM. At that time we also changed from the all sports format to a nostalgia music format. We also feature Imus in the Morning, and local high school and college sports.

KQWB operates with a daytime power of 10 kW non-directional. At night we operate at 5 kW with a 5-tower directional array, the directional pattern takes our signal mostly to the West. Our transmitter site is located 10 miles North of Glyndon, MN and our studios are in Fargo, ND. We use dual Harris MW-5 transmitters in a combined configuration. The station uses CRL audio processing with a Inovonics NRSC compliant peak limiter.
