I am very pleased to report reception of KCNI on Nov. 20, 1976 from 12:36a CST to 12:50a CST on your assigned frequency of 1280 kHz. Your signal strength was Fair.

There are three reasons for this form report. 1. I am a lousy typist. 2. I usually forget to give the station some info of value. 3. My handwriting is worse than most Doctors! I hope you will still consider this report valuable.

The following are the program details which I would like to offer as proof of my reception:

12:36a Tone on channel
12:40a ID "KCNI Broken Bow Nebraska" and more tone
12:45a ID "KCNI Broken Bow Nebraska testing for external frequency check, KCNI Broken Bow Nebraska" and more tone
12:50a KCNI ID way under KTLK

Interference here was mainly KTLK, 5000w Denver Colo. a little WGSO New Orleans was also noted.

For your information I use a World War II surplus NAVY receiver with a 4' loop antenna. This antenna is directional and was specially designed for Broadcast Band reception by a member of the NRC. I am located on the near east side of Colorado Springs about 20 miles from Pikes Peak.

I am enclosing return postage to facilitate your reply. If my report is found to be correct I'd appreciate a verification letter or card for my collection.
