It was very good to get such a nice signal report from you regarding our KINF – AM signal in the Denver area.

I noticed that you have been into broadcast hunting for quite some time and that you have heard KBCQ and KCKN. Actually these call signs are related to the same physical transmitter facility from times past.

Back in the days of the call sign of KBCQ we were running an old RCA transmitter that finally died in a fire one night during a very active lightning storm. At that time we then installed the present Continental 317-C transmitter.


We recently moved our studio and production facilities to our new location in Roswell, New Mexico at 5206 West 2nd Street. Our sales department has moved into a facility down in the middle of town so that they now have better exposure to the areas that they need to work in.

The KINF transmitter facility is now operated by remote control and studio transmitter links in the 900-MHZ band. The actual transmitter site is now unmanned after many years of very active studio, sales, and production activity at that old transmitter site.

located on a 30-acre field North of Roswell, New Mexico.


Pattern: **Day:** North lobe at 340 degrees, South lobe at 170 Degrees

Automation: We operate a SCOTT STUDIOS automation system for unmanned
operation during night time hours.

This station has been operating since the mid 1970's. Our studios are combined
with our sister FM stations KBCQ, KMOU, and KSFY.
