Dear Mr. Heinen:

This is to confirm your reception of radio station KAKC in Tulsa, Oklahoma. KAKC operates a 5,000 watt directional array in the daytime, and a tighter 1,000 watt directional array nighttime. The transmitter is just south of Tulsa, Oklahoma, in the city of Bixby. The station is owned and operated by Clear Channel Communications, Inc.

In 1986 radio station KAKC, operating on 970 KHz, changed it's calls to KCFO-AM. On February 1, 1987, our station, (then KBBJ, also known as "KJ-13"), picked up the calls as part of an effort to resurrect the sound of a bygone era, when KAKC was the most popular station in the area. We removed the AM Stereo system which had been in use at the time, and installed vintage audio processing, circa 1960, such as the Gates "Solid Statesman", in order to re-create the actual sound and feel of the station. The music is from the 50's - 60's era. We have found and are airing many of the original jingles and liners as well. Our slogan is "KAKC: The Legend Returns!".
