Thank-you for your reception report of December 11, 1995 from 7:45 am to 7:48am CST. Your report was indeed accurate in regard to our station programming. Please accept this letter as a confirmation of your report.

CJVR operates non-directional day and directional at night with protection towards the south-east (WSB, Atlanta) at 10,000 watts. Our four tower transmitter site is located approximately 30 kilometers south of Melfort near Pleasantdale, Sask. We are AM stereo, running a Nautel AMPFET10 solid-state transmitter. The studios are located in Melfort utilizing a Scott Studios digital On-Air system and our Newsroom is digital as well using the INES system supplied by Broadcast News, a subsidiary of the Canadian Press. We have a staff of 23 and market in an area approximately within 160 km of Melfort. CJVR moved from 1420 kHz to 750 kHz on July 14, 1995.
