Congratulations on hearing KIRO's signal in Colorado Springs. We do not get many QSO's from there since we protect WOR in New York, and you are pretty much on our night-time null.

You mention getting us on a Navy surplus receiver, and I am curious as to whether it might be an old WWII Scott. I am a Scott Radio collector, and have two of the Navy rack mount receivers myself. They are quite an interesting part of the history of the E. H. Scott Labs of Chicago.


I've always been interested in DX'ing and Scott sets and listen principally to the SW bands: European broadcasts, etc. My favorite is a 32-tube "Phi Iharmonic" model Scott circa 1941, and also use a Model 800B upstairs in my front room. The 800B was a direct outgrowth of the afore mentioned Navy Low-Radiation Marine radio.

Have a friend in Windsor, Colorado, Mr. Quinn Morrison who works for various stations in that area, and he sold me a 1938 Scott Model XII which I am in the process of restoring. I will use it as a carrier check receiver here at KIRO in the shop. I like to make these old sets work for their living, and take pride in what astounding performance they are capable of. The fidelity, bandwidth, sensitivity, and selectivity are unusual for AM radios, and possible only in a custom manufactured set, I believe.

I am interested in collecting, purchasing, or whatever anything that pertains to old E. H. Scott equipment (not to be confused with the later H. H. Scott of Connecticut, famous for the later Stereo and Hi-Fi equipment). I also collect old Western Electric broadcast equipment.

Thank you for the letter, and hope you catch many other stations.
