Received your letter of Dec 29th with much interest. You were undoubtedly in tune with KFAA. The first program you heard was "Starring Boris Karloff"... an ABC program played here on a delayed basis. I remember the lines you quoted as specifically being in the episode aired at 10 p.m. AST, the evening of Dec 28th. The second program you heard was the "Zero Hour", a locally produced show; featured recorded dance music. This was aired at 11 p.m. AST. Weather here that evening was unusually cold and the temperature at one time read about 45 degrees below zero. Perhaps this accounted in some way for your reception. About a year ago we received a similar letter from a gentleman near New York City. At that time WNBC also came on and obliterated us. To my knowledge, KFAA and WNBC are the only American stations on 660...both operating on a clear channel. We thank you for your kind letter and look forward to hearing from you again.
