Dear Sir:

Thank you very much for your fine reception of KWAK, on the morning of January 25, 1949.

You asked me for our check period time and here it is before I forget it: The fourth Tuesday morning of each month, 1:45-2:00 AM CST. I would appreciate another letter if you should hear us again. We are using Gates Equipment throughout, with a Wincharger Tower, 207 feet tall. Our transmitter is 250-6 and we have 120 copper radials, 200 ft. long, buried about six inches for the ground system. The night that you happened to hear us, our ground system was almost covered with water, due to the heavy rains in this area.

We must have been pushing a good signal your way, for we have received many reports from New England and Canada and really appreciate every one of them.

If you should hear us again, be sure to send me another report. I sincerely want to thank you again.
