This letter will verify that it was KNOG that you heard on Monday morning, August 29, 1949.

We were on the air for an extra frequency check, due to the fact that our regularly scheduled one was not heard the previous Monday morning.

Our regular frequency check schedule is every third Monday of the month, from 1:45 to 2:00 A.M., Mountain standard time.

Yours is one of the best DX letters we have so far received here at KNOG, having been on the air since August 15, 1948, or a little more than a year.

Our transmitter is a Western Electric 451-A, grid modulated job. Our speech input is Western Electric 25-B.

As to the QRM, there are a couple of other stations not too far from here on 1340 KC. KCNA, Tucson is 1340, and they have a hefty 253' Idaco Tower, contrasted with our guyed 153'. It may be possible that they were skipping in with characteristics similar to ours, except that they were a little more consistent.

Thanks a lot for the letter old man, and we'll be more than glad to verify you just any time at all.
