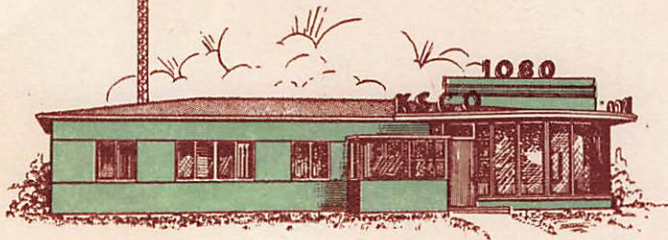

Dear Mr. Brauner :

Many Thanks for your letter of October 1st. We are happy to confirm your reception of KSCO at 1:40 AM PST on September 30, 1949. At that time KSCO was engaged in routine maintenance on our transmitter and were in the process of getting set to measure our audio frequency response and distortion.

This is the second report we have received from the state of New York on this date.

KSCO operates with 1000 watts days and 500 watts or night power using a directional antenna to protect KRLD, WTIC, and KWJJ in Portland Oregon. At the time you heard us, we were using 1000watts non directional. Our antenna system is located in a salt water lagoon and should account for better than average reception of our signal.

Our regular operating schedule is from 6AM PST to 11:05 PM PST on Mondays through Saturdays. On Sundays we operate from 7AM PST to 11:05 PST.

Thank you once again for your very excellent report on the reception of KSCO.
