Received your report of receiving our frequency check on August 28, 1950. This letter is to confirm your report on each item you mentioned. I put the station on the air at 2:12AM using a 1500 cycle tone and identifying each four or five minutes. I signed off at approximately 2:54AM.

I want to thank you very much for your interest in sending us a report on our signal. We are a relatively new station, only being on since May 14, 1950. We are owned by the kilowatt station K F X J in Grand Junction, Colo. and our output has been a question since before we went on the air. We are located in a valley surrounded on four sides by mountains within a radius of five miles. The nearest mountain is within one-half mile due north of the tower.

In the same mail with your letter this morning, I received a letter from Raleigh Biss 385 W. Wilson, Banning California reporting reception of the same frequency check. Also the frequency monitoring company in Kansas City reported clear reception.

I was wondering if you were a ham or a SWL? Due to the excessive QRN during the summer months here, I am not on with K C L G 2 on 40 meters and also as CAP station on 2374KC however if you are on the air next winter would like to contact you.

If you are ever in this part of the country would be glad to have you stop in. Glenwood springs is a year round vacationland and I believe you would enjoy a visit here.
