It was very good to hear from you again and your kind letter of January 28th was particularly interesting to us all here.


We had a very good response to this test here from Victoria, B.C., in Western Canada, Gananoque, Ont., in Eastern Canada, and from Maine, Conn., Maryland, Alabama, Missouri, Indiana, Iowa, Illinois, New York City, Colorado, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Mass., Vt., New Jersey, Mich., Neb., Kans., Tenn., Nevada, Calif. We were not able to get to the south-west portion of the States this time, apparently on account of Station KGFJ who were on at the same time. Every letter we got contained more than sufficient information to verify reception, although some in the east complained of very heavy static.

We have been approached by the International Dxers' Alliance to put on a test and we are doing so on the morning of March 11th, between 1:00 & 5:00 A.M., MST. We could not, however, leave the Newark News Radio Club out of any of our Dx 's so ^{we} are dedicating part of the program to your Club, between 2:00 & 3:00 A.M., MST.
