Dear Mr. Brauner:

Many thanks for the excellent report on equipment test during the morning of October 3rd. All details outlined in your letter were exactly as transmitted. From Ocala the air line distance to Williamsville is over 1,000 miles and your report exceeds any we have had to date.

Static was extremely bad in this area and it was with difficulty WWV was copied for a time check prior to the test. In fact I had my doubts about the transmission reaching Atlanta, Ga. where measurements are made.

It has been the policy of this station to conduct equipment test for frequency measurements, the first Sunday in each month from 5:35 until 5:55 a.m. EST.

For your information the unannounced records used October 3rd were Dixie, Melody in F, Neapolitan Nights, My Best To You, Latin Lady, Ferryboat Serenade and After The Ball. All except Dixie and Latin Lady were by Ken Griffin.

Organ numbers of uniform level are selected as requested by the engineer making measurements, also it provides a means of identification in case interference develops from a 50 Kw foreign station of the same frequency.

Again thanking you for your interesting letter and trust you will continue to receive new stations and when conditions permit will include WMOP.
