Dear J. W.:


We do very much appreciate your reception report of our signal heard by you October 14, 1948. At the time we had just made a repair on the Collins 20 T and were in the process of making adjustments.


I have checked over the equipment test entries made in our log and find your information to be correct. Therefore, this letter will serve as your verification report.
