We are indeed happy to verify your reception of WGGA on Nov. 3, 1941, at 6:00 a.m. EST., as we find the information submitted by you is entirely in agreement with our logs.

If we were rather slow in answering your nice report we would like to plead that we are almost too busy to write letters. There are only two engineers here that keep the station on seventeen hours per day.

The transmitting equipment here is all RCA, with the 250K as transmitter operating with 250 watts power. Antenna is a 200 foot Wincharger vertical.

Gainesville is situated fifty miles north-east of Atlanta, Georgia, and is seventy miles from the Georgia-South Carolina line. The population is fifteen thousand.

We are always happy to hear from our distant listeners and try to be as prompt as possible to reply to all reports received. For the benefit of our distant listeners we propose to conduct a DX program on January 15, 1942, from 4:15 until 5:15 a.m. EST. Also we shall be conducting a frequency measurement test from about 3:50 am. on that same morning. We wish you the best of reception if you care to listen.
