Dear Mr. Brauner:

In reply to your letter of March 27, 1951 I am pleased to verify that you did receive this station on test Tuesday morning, March 27, from 5:20 to 5:24 A.M. and on regular broadcast from 5:30 to about 5:45 A.M. EST. We were using a tone generator of 1000 cycles on test.

We do not use the National Anthem as a station theme, but instead use an excerpt from Gaité Parisienne which may have sounded like the National Anthem with fading. Otherwise, your information was entirely correct and the "something that could be obtained in Rome, Ga." was information in regard to Social Security.

WGTA went on the air August 27, 1950. Our transmitter is a new General Electric, Monitor is new General Electric, Console is new General Electric, and Limiting Amplifier is Pro-Gar. We have a Shunt fed Stainless tower 250' high.
