We thank you for reporting as this is the only check we have on our transmitters quality and coverage. KFJB will transmit its next DX Sat. Jan. 13 1934 the hour to be announced in all DX tip sheets. We hope you will pick us up and report on our signals.

The Nov. 25 program was as success as we received reports from 30 states and 4 Prov. of Canada. The most distant reporter to date was in Seattle Wash. and his report incidently was the only one received from the Pacific coast due to KGFJ the 24 hr. station in Los Angeles. The second best was from Westport N.S. The third was from Swampscott Mass.

Dozens of reports were received which complimented us on the talent used, we appreciate this very much as this all they got for their trouble. Your report was exceedingly interesting and valueable. Heavy static was reported thru-out the U.S. Nov. 25, however after the broadcast was able to pick up VE9EK and CHRC. Put in the personal touch when you report next time you receive our station. Report to me direct. TNX OM.
