Dear Mr. Brauner:

This is to acknowledge your very interesting letter dated Sept. 21st., and to verify your reception of WIAS on our test program between 2:04 and 3:35 A.M., Sunday Sept. 21st.

I enjoyed very much reading your letter and I appreciated a lot your detailed report on reception of our station. You will know that we were pleased to receive your letter when I tell you that on this particular test program, your report was the first one from that far east. Other letters came in from Chicago and Milwaukee, and all of them reporting good reception.

I want to explain why you picked us up on 1500 kc. instead of 1420 kc. We have a construction permit for a new transmitter, including crystal control, but we are just starting on the job, and so without the crystal, as we are operating at the present time, our frequency control is rather indefinite. However our frequency is still supposed to be 1420 kc.

Thanks very much for your splendid letter, and hope to hear from you again. I may drop you a
