Dear Sir;

Received your letter this morning when I came to work and was very glad to hear from you. Your letter was the first ~~to~~ arrive this time and it is suprising since you are so far away.

The weather here was clear and the temperature was about 40. I expected to hear from someone from quite a distance. It always seems funny that we cover New York so good at night because that direction is our worst coverage in the daytime. We only go about 60 miles that way in the regular broadcast time.

About not hearing the carrier frequency given, I simply forgot to state it. I seemed for some reason or other to be a little sleepy. I got the report on our frequency this morning also and we were about 11 cycles high. Our frequency monitor is apparently off because I set the carrier before I went on the air. It had been reading 10 cycles low for about six weeks, but I guess it must be about that much off.

Our transmitter is a Gates BC*500*~~Q~~ coupled to a 200 ft. shunt fed tower. We use Gates audio equipment throughout and have a variety of microphones. Our operation is combined and located about 2 miles west of Paris on Rt#133 in east central Illinois. Paris is a farming community and the town itself has about 9300 people.
