This letter will serve as a verification of WTAD's DX program dedicated to the CDXR on January 31st, 1934.


On behalf of the engineer, I wish to sincerely thank you for your comprehensive report. We feel that your technical reports as to signal strength, quality and fading of more value than those reporting hearing this or that recording.

We were reported from Maine to California and from Montreal to Saskatoon. One report came from West Virginia in south-east. All reported considerable fading, which we presume was due to full moon. Altho those reports from Manitoba and Saskatchewan comment on volume and no fading.
