This note will confirm your report of reception near Buffalo, New York of WKO A on January 15, 1955. The points you list are quite accurate but I wish we could have pushed in signal enough for you to really "hear" us. Maybe conditions will be better another time. I think your report is our 23rd since going on the air in mid-September, the furthest one from Laconia, N. H., a distance of some 950 airline miles. We never tire of hearing from DX-ers, though, so thanks for the report and write again any time.

We have some work to do on the equipment this Saturday or Sunday morning (that is after 12:00 M) and will probably be on the air some on one of those mornings. Sorry I can't be more definite as to day and hour, but plans are not complete, yet.

Incidentally, WKO A signs on every day at 5:00 A. M., and signs off at local sunset (5:00 P. M. this month). CST, of course. WKO A uses Gates equipment throughout, the transmitter being their BC-1F (1-KW) shunt-feeding ~~KK~~ a 150' tower.
