Dear Joe,

Thanks very much for your letter reporting reception of WFMD on our special DX program from 4 - 5:15 Sunday morning, January 27. Although you already have a verie, I'll send another. Your first verie was probably for 500 watts. This is for 1000 and for new RCA equipment. Therefore...this is your verification.

We've had 20 reports so far, Joe, with more to come, I'm sure. Fellows close to WPAT heard us OK, but had some trouble. Out west we were much stronger. I'll have a complete report for Sid Rosenbaum after all the mail gets in.

I, too, have heard WVOW. It's a powerhouse here. My best catch of the week was just after midnight on 1360 kc yesterday a.m. There must have been four stations audible...WKAT, WSAI, WBAY, WPPA, and I don't know what others, but I heard KRIS, Corpus Christi, through the whole bunch. WLIO on 1570 this morning at 8:15 made 675 for me. Say, I'm sure I heard a station with call WMPA in Aberdeen, Miss. I don't have it listed, though I don't have Weyrich's log. Think it is 1240. One of the gut frequencies, anyway.

Thanks again, Joe. The enclosure was supposed to be a verie, but by misunderstanding was printed on a blank sheet instead of on a letterhead.
