In the wee small hours of a cold rain-soaked December morning -- three cars bearing members of the Baltimore Booster's of the NNPC, came to stop before Frederick's Francis Scott Key Hotel --- Maryland's newest radio station was the objective of these chilled but courageous NNRC'ers ---- And in the studios of W F M D, these DX'ers, with Lloyd S. Hahn conducting, presented an extremely entertaining program from 3:30 'til 5:00 AM - EST.

W F M D has studios and offices in the Francis Scott Key Hotel in Frederick...The 500 watt transmitter is located $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the city, just off the Frederick - Harper's-Ferry Highway. (Route 340)

W F M D uses a 257 ft. vertical radiator -- the ground system consists of 126 radials of #10 copper wire -- which totals eight miles and is constructed as a spider web from the base of the tower.

W F M D transmits on a frequency of 900 Kilocycles. from 6:30 AM 'til local sunset, EST.
