Dear sir,

This will acknowledge receipt of, and thank you for, your letter of the 15th.

We are indeed glad to hear from you and to verify your report of reception of our signals on 15 November 1948, during our frequency measurement period from 0500 to 0515,-- which, by the way is scheduled for the third monday in each month. Your log as given in your letter is in complete agreement with our transmitter log, and I think that I will agree with you that your reception of our signal is quite an accomplishment, and I think that you are to be congratulated on your perseverance in digging us out of the QRM.

WFAU is using a Ratheon 250 watt transmitter with a quarter wave vertical guyed lattice tower with 120 quarter wave buried radials in predominantly clay soil. We are located on a main highway 1 mile out of Augusta, with offices, studios and transmitter housed in one building, making a very compact plant.

We have had some quite nice reports from points even beyond your radius, but of course these were the results of exceptional conditions, which do exist at times, and during those times one can hardly forecast what will take place even though propagation characteristics are quite well known on the broadcast band.

Again accept our thanks for your very nice report, and let us hear from you again if we "edge thru" the QRM.
