Dear Sir:

I was pleased to get your letter the other day stating that you had heard our test program of September 2nd. at 3:50 to 4:10 am E.S.T. Thank you very much for the fine report of this program. I certainly regret that you have had difficulty in getting a verification from us in the past and certainly hope this letter will make up for the neglect in the past. I showed your letter to the engineer at the transmitter and he was pleased to note that you are now getting us much better than when the station first came to Kalamazoo.

We have done much testing and changing in the past year and have made changes tending to improve our signal strength and quality. We believe that we have made very definite improvement and your report bears this out. It might interest you to know that we have had four letters from New Zealand during the past few months. We seem to put a good signal in there.

I have never done much announcing as I am a control operator and transmitting engineer. I hope I didn't sound too amateurish!

You will find an Ekko stamp enclosed. I have been with the station for about a year but never announced except in test programs. We will be on October 7th at the same time of the day to check our frequency with the Government Monitoring Station and I will probably announce again Hi Hi!

We'll be glad to know how we are coming in then. Hoping we may have the privilege of giving you another dx program in October I remain,
