Dear Mr. Brauner:

Thank you very much for your letter of the twenty-fourth. We are pleased to verify reception of this station on October twenty-third and twenty-fourth of this year.

It is very surprising to us that our signal is "getting out" in the manner that it apparently is. Only yesterday I verified a signal report from a BCL in Toronto who received WS00 on the 22nd and 23rd.

The surprising thing is that when we open up in the morning, the power is at 100 watts for about the first fifteen minutes. This because our time is calculated from the central standard time zone, and sunrise there isn't until about 6:15 or 6:20. And we seem to be overriding other, more powerful stations, at that time.

The transmitter in use here is an RCA 250-K, using a pair of 810 tubes in the final amplifier, high level modulated; the antenna, a 205 foot Blaw-Knox tower, with the latest type of radial ground system.

Again thank you for your report, and I might add, that if you have friends that would like a veri from this station, we will qsl 100%.
