Dear Mr. Brauner,

I am very sorry I haven't gotten around to answering your letter of December 12, but to the rush season of the holidays and trying to get away from the station for a few days my work has suffered.

I very much appreciate your deep and continuing interest in KOBK. It is certainly gratifying to know, that we do have listeners at that early hour, even if they are as Buffalo.

According to your information in regards to the broadcast of December 12, I'm sure that you did have KOBK in solid. At that early hour, every other selection we play is old time music. On the morning of January 16, I will keep a record of the music that we play and the commercials and forward that on to you so we will have an accurate check.

This past month I received a letter from V. Eugene Cameron of Spokane, Wash. stating he received our signal clearly on the morning of December 5, 1954. It appears that our little 500W station is doing all right for itself.

The policy here at KOBK is no add libbing, so we can get in as much music as possible. In some respects this is very fine, but on the other hand it does get quite boring to just read commercials and news and spinning discs. We adopted this policy last April, and have not had too much comment on it for our local people... although some of the high school crowd are complaining as we did away with our request program for them in the afternoon.

I hope you will keep on trying to receive KOBK in the future, and I will try to be more cooperative in replying to your letters.
