

Dear Mr. Brauner,

We are pleased and happy to verify your report of hearing our station on the air last January 18, 1950. Your report of hearing music starting at 2:30 A.M., CST, plus station break and then more music continuing until 2:35 is correct. It was 28 degrees below zero here that night and so cold that the copper center wire in our co-ax contracted and seperated at a solder joint. Thus we had been off the air repairing same during the night and you heard a short test after the break was repaired. We do not test at all after midnight unless in a case of this kind. It is very possible that next summer we may be on the air 24 hours a day. We recieved about twenty reports from your part of the country that night so the skip must have been just right. We operate a Collins 250 watt transmitter model W-A2 and are having good results with it.

Thanks for the letter and hope to hear from you again.
