
We are a 250 watt daytime station. We have only been in operation since the 29th of December and so all our Gates equipment, ground wires and so forth are all new. We use a 150 ft. guyed tower.

Our programming consists of music throughout the day with five minute news broadcasts on the hour.

We have only run one frequency check after midnight to date and do not expect to run any others as we are being checked from Kansas City, Missouri at 6:30 on Sunday mornings. It might be you could pick us up again at that time, if weather conditions and so forth are favorable.

We certainly appreciate your letter and hope this information will be of use to you.
