Dear Sir :

In answer to your letter of the seventh, this month, which contained a highly informative listing of the stations heard during the "Missouri Day" test, I regret to state that this station was not on during this test. We were one of the first ones to make clear our intention of making this test, only to be probably one of the very few that didn't produce.

Being an Army Reservist, I was called to active duty prior to this test and didn't get out until 7 Nov, just one day following the test. The Engineer taking over my position was duly told of this contemplated test but apparently either overlooked it or wasn't interested. Frankly, I'll probably never know. I had considerable correspondence with Jack Khea of the Newark News Radio Club, who arranged this test, if I understand correctly. As yet, I have not had the heart to contact him after our station failed so miserably.

I might list our regular frequency test period which might make it possible for you to log us. This test runs the first Thursday of each month from 5:40 to 5:55am CST. Usually we use a 500 cycle note as provided by our local frequency monitor. This check is made with the Commercial Radio Monitoring Company in Kansas City, Mo. I sincerely hope that you will be able to log us at some future date. Being a ham, I am more than glad to aid in such hobbies and appreciate all DX reports sent this station.

Our DX reports are rather few and I was banking on this early morning test to increase the volume. Perhaps we can get on another schedule in the future and come through.
