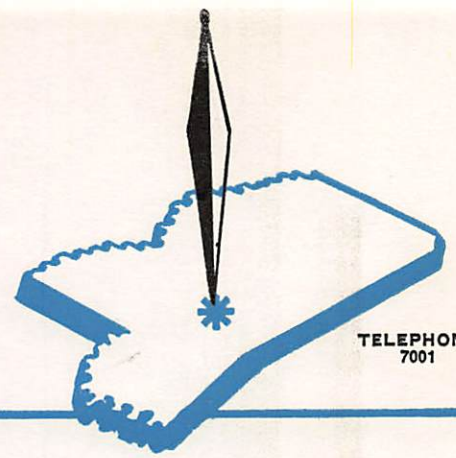

Dear Sir:

We were very pleased with your report of reception of Radio WMAG on November 21, 1955. This is a letter of verification of reception.

We are always glad to hear from you National Radio Club Members. And, it may interest you to know that we received a letter from a NRC member in Belleville, N.J. which is close to CJBC in Toronto, Canada.

WMAG is a 500 watt station, daytime power only. We sign on at sunrise and sign off at sunset. Our sign on and off time is governed by local sunrise and sunset time.

The announcer you heard on Monday, November 21, 1955, was Tom Estes, with 7 years experience in Radio behind him. He is the program director for WMAG. He signs on at 5:00 a.m., possibly you could pick him up again.

The transmitter for WMAG is located about 3 miles from town and is in a marsh-land, in fact, a small canal runs almost under it. That is the reason for such good reception I believe.
